A kit based on the “I Am, I’ll Be” study data

In February, the Institut launched the SurvEd kit on success in school. This tool consists of 13 fact sheets that summarize results presented in the publications produced with the study’s data. This kit is designed to make results more accessible and useful to stakeholders from all sectors working for student retention and success in school... and all those who have the future of youth at heart!

These sheets present popularized summaries of results relating to school success of young people and cover topics such as parent-school collaboration, teacher-student relationship, motivation, victimization, school performance and risk of dropping out.
